Objectives of the SWGB scheme for sustainable vineyard management include:

- Manage the vineyards sustainably, with minimal pesticide and fertiliser inputs
- Protect the vineyard soils, conserve the environment and promote biodiversity
- Minimise the vineyard carbon footprint per hectare
